By the grace of God, we are blessed to be a blessing! Here's to our next carolling session in 2024!










Looking Back at "Fairfield! The Musical

PROPS TEAM:





At about 5pm, the show kicked off with one of my favourites - the Kallang Wave. This got everyone excited, setting the tone for the evening.

We were extremely excited when the red lions descended from the sky. They jumped from a Singapore Air Force C-130 Hercules aircraft at over 12,500 feet. At first, they were tiny black spots in the sky. Then, they opened their parachutes and glided gracefully down to the Padang. The crowd erupted with screams, yells and cheers! The military march-past and aerial display were equally exhilarating. As the fighter jets

zoomed past, the ground trembled. It was as loud as thunder. During the march-past, some members of the marching contingents fainted, shocking the audience. According to a teacher, they had to keep moving to maintain blood circulation. The stamina and resilience displayed by the participants were truly impressive.

My absolute favourite moment was the NDP 2023 theme song 'Shine Your Light'. Singers on stage performed while hundreds of secondary school students, dressed in white with red capes, danced along. In the most exciting part of the song, a lion rose from the Padang, with fireworks blooming behind it. Fireworks soared above the seats, painting the sky in a whirl of colours, creating a spectacular display.

In each issue we interview a Fairsian to find out more about him/her after he/she left us. In this issue we sent the questions to Susan Ang who was with us for both her primary and secondary education.

Please tell us a little about yourself, e.g., your full name, how long were you in Fairfield and your year of graduation.

My name is Dr Ang Hwee Quan Susan. I was in Fairfield Methodist Schools from 1983 (Primary 3) to my graduation in1990 (Secondary 4).

Currently, I am a Dental Surgeon with Q&M Dental Group and I am also an adjunct lecturer with Nanyang Polytechnic School of Health and Social Sciences. I volunteer as a community volunteer and a teacher aide in my free time. I also enjoy doing housekeeping and travelling. .

My primary school years were smooth and routine. I was a school prefect and I participated in the Choir.

My secondary school years were undoubtedly more challenging and tumultuous as I embarked on a journey of growth and self-searching. Like many teenagers, I had tendencies to test boundaries. In Secondary 2, I was suspended from school for missing school without official notice. That period was my lowest point in Fairfield but the overwhelming comfort and support I received from my friends and teachers gave me the determination to do good with my life from then on.

2. What were your CCAs in school?

My CCAs in school were Math and Science Society, Computer Club and Badminton Club.

3. What are your best memories of Fairfield?

Fairfield has given me a lot of fond memories and gifts. My best memories of Fairfield are the people in Fairfield and the camaraderie of my classmates and fellow Fairsians. Every one of my classmates is awesome and unique in his and her own ways. I left Fairfield 34 years ago but some of their quirkiness are still deeply ingrained in my mind.

The greatest gifts Fairfield has given me are my friends, who are still a big part of my life today. I am overjoyed every time I meet

a fellow Fairsian! Such is undeniably our Fairsian bond. My personal journey and my learning journey in Fairfield were rich and my experience in Fairfield have been nothing short of the best.

5. What did you do after graduation?

After my graduation in 1990 from Fairfield, I went on to pursue my A levels at Anglo Chinese Junior College. In 1993, I was admitted into the Faculty of Dentistry in the National University of Singapore (NUS). I graduated in 1997 with a Bachelor of Dental Surgery and served as a Dental Officer in Choa Chu Kang Polyclinic and Paya Lebar Airbase Dental Centre.

6. How long have you been in Q&M?

In 1999, I joined my current company Q&M Dental Group as a dental associate before becoming a partner in 2002. Q&M Dental group initially had 2 clinics--at Bukit Batok and Toa Payoh Central. I joined Q&M Dental because of a classmate who had just signed up with Dr Ng Chin Siau, our precedent partner then and now CEO. I have never looked back on this decision. Working in a group like this has given me the flexibility to spend more time with my family, explore other hobbies and devote time to continual learning. Besides my degree in Dentistry, I also have a postgraduate diploma in Health Services Management. Lately, I also completed a Mediator Accreditation assessment with the Singapore Mediation Centre.

7. What is your role in the company?

I am a clinician and my role is to deliver dental care to the clients of the company. I also supervise dental surgeons who are on conditional registration as and when required. I see the full range of patients but my interest lies mainly in aesthetic dentistry.

8. Any words of wisdom for your junior Fairsians?

Seize the Day. Do something today that your future self will thank you for.

Your Mindset is your biggest attribute or obstacle. Change your mind and you change your life. Do not expect others to change. It is easier to change yourself.
