

1. Your full name, year of graduation and class:

Ee Fei-Wen, Favian; 1994; 4B.

2. What were your CCAs in school? (ps: CCA is the modern name for ECA!)

NCC Land and Fairsian Times.

3. What were your best memories of Fairfield?

Publishing my first comic book! Also playing the angel-mortal game, and having my essays published in the school magazine. The history trip to Malacca in Sec. 3 was the first time I travelled overseas without family. I enjoyed it tremendously.

4. Who were some of your most memorable teachers?

My upper secondary form teacher Mr. Marcus Khoo, who was also my NCC Land teacher, left a deep impression on me. The late Mrs. Soon, my Sec. 1 form teacher, encouraged my art by helping laminate some bookmarks I drew. Two of the teachers who passed away in the SilkAir crash also taught me. Mrs. Tan was my upper secondary art teacher, and Ms. Yee taught me literature in lower secondary. I was serving my National Service and came back for the memorial service. It was a time of deep mourning for Fairfield.

5. When/How did you first start drawing? Where do you draw inspiration for your illustrations?

I've been drawing since young and gravitated to creating comics very early on. It was only much later that I realised most of my drawing has been done in service of some kind of story, and that I'm a storyteller at heart. I enjoy writing too, so the comics medium suits me well as it combines writing with drawing.

My inspiration comes from many places - books I read, stories I create, things I see (especially when doing urban sketching and drawing outdoors), and my Christian faith. 6: Other than your recent book "John Wesley: The World, My Parish", what are some other memorable commissions or projects that you have done?

The Fairfield Comic 2 was my first ever published comic. Mrs. Laura Leong helped bring my drawings to print in 1995, the year after I graduated, and the books were sold at the funfair for fund raising. I also used to produce Christian cartoon stationery under the brand Wen's World Christian Comics, some of which were sold at the Fairfield Secondary bookshop in the late 2000s. More recently I was commissioned by the People's Association and Senior Minister Tharman during the pandemic to do an illustration to accompany his Chinese calligraphy. The drawing of a multiracial group of people on a boat in the storm was laser-etched on wood and installed next to his calligraphy (which says "风雨同舟") at Taman Jurong CC.

John Wesley: The World, My Parish is a 100-page full color graphic novel on the life of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism. It was a commission by The Methodist Church in Singapore and took almost two years to complete. For someone like myself who loves drawing comics and reading biographies, and who takes his faith seriously, it was a dream project to work on.

7. Do you have a favourite type of topic (e.g nature, people, places) that you like to draw?
